08/23.a	To discuss rate setting and budgets for YE 2024.
	The clerks had circulated information prior to the meeting. Several spreadsheets were placed in
	front of Members on which various budget options were presented. The meeting was advised
	that the majority of contractors were indicating price increases that were in line with the current
	& projected rate of inflation. This was due to the economic downturn and the subsequent rise in
	inflation. The maintenance budget was discussed. It was noted that other bodies such as the
	NCAS Committee had yet to confirm their budgets. The clerks were instructed to consider raising
	this budget in the next budget that was presented. In these circumstances it was agreed to
	postpone rate-setting to a later date in January until the information had been received and all
	Members were present.

	reduce damp build up.
	The Board resolved to issue no objection to this proposal. The clerks were instructed to invite
	MNH representatives to a meeting to brief the Commissioners on the plans for the Cross House
	and for the extension of the Village Hall as a presentation centre for the crosses. It was noted
	that these projects were at properties owned by the church authorities and as such the
	Commissioners were not permitted to assist with any funding.
09/23.b	To discuss approval decision on: 21/00064/B Conversion of residential care home (class 3.2) to
•	self-contained apartments & a dwelling (class 3.3 and 3.4) with associated parking.
	Glen House Residential Home New Road Laxey.
	The Commissioners had been represented at Planning Committee when this application was
	approved. Because of the restricted size of the site, only six dedicated parking spaces would be
	provided. The Commissioners had argued that the provision was completely inadequate and
	would result in further parking pressures and inconvenience in the central Village. The Planning
	Officer had recommended approval and set aside the usual parking requirements on the basis
	that parking would always be an issue whatever use the building was put to in the future. It
	would also ensure that the building did not become derelict and an eyesore in the Village. He
	also stated that the site was on a major bus route which would be a disincentive to car
	ownership and added that the new residents would bring additional custom for the local
	businesses.
	The consensus was that not enough had been done to find a solution to the parking issues that
	many Members felt would ensue. The parking situation would be monitored once the
	development had taken place and further consultation would take place with DEFA, the owners
	of the Glen approach and Laxey Glen. Enforceable parking restrictions could also be
	considered.
